Spotted enjoying the sunshine on a car door.

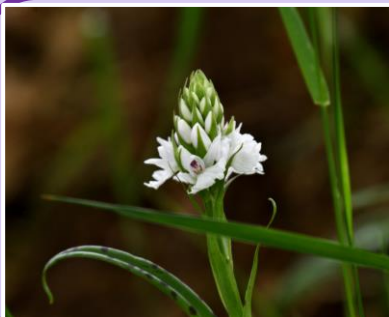
